Isis scored a comfortable win against O.U.P. at a resplendent Jordan Hill, bathed in sunshine. With a good toss won, openers Stephenson (28) and Penhallurick (43) enjoyed themselves, picking up runs with alacrity. O.U.P. never gave up though, and plugged away to take their wickets, while a long Isis tail, with some lusty blows from Naqvi, kept up the scoreboard pressure. A nice cameo finish from Wyatt and Walter saw Isis to a credible 136 for 7 at the turn. The hosts put on a decent show with the bat, though they were always chasing. New man Alex Bevan put himself about the field, and the O.U.P. innings featured a couple of smart run outs and a somewhat fluke stumping from Jacobs. Chris Heron (39) in particular, batting at 6, took the game back to Isis, and until he was cleverly bowled by Naqvi there was faint hope. But the Isis total always looked to be a stretch too far, and as a brilliant sun dipped behind the trees the innings ended at 119 for 9, Ponsford and East taking the bowling honours with a brace apiece. It was also nice to see Joe Walter bounce back from the previous evening with a wicket and an economical return.
