Match Report

Isis recorded an easy win against Hampstead Norries at Queens in this inaugural meeting of the two teams in the Friendly Cup first round. All credit to the visitors for fulfilling the fixture after finding themselves four men short, and well done to Keith Ponsford, Alan East, Eddie Hyde and Isis junior Kieron Malcolm for agreeing to play for them. This reporter only saw the last 30 mins or so, but before tea Dave Penhallurick enjoyed himself, scoring a nice 52 before retiring, and supported by Harry Stoneman (39), Ravi Kella (42) and Paul Jacobs (23). For the opposition, Kieron opened the bowling and returned nice figures, Alan East bamboozled the Isismen too and Keith Ponsford proved his prowess with a trio of wickets. But Isis reached a formidable 197, and from that point the visitors were always chasing. In the second innings, Dom Henry was the pick of the bowlers with a tidy spell and three wickets, but all of the bowlers were economical, and the match was more or less over shortly after the drinks break. Eight Isis bowlers were used, and when I turned up Ponsford and East were in a batting partnership carving the ball all around the square, before the latter carried favour with the Isis captain and gave him his wicket, to leave Keith Ponsford coaching the 11-year-old eleventh man through the final overs of Kella and Penhallurick.
