Match Report

There was a chaotic start to the game as an Isis eleven arrived at Horspath C.C., a flustered Nick Wyatt broke his car key and then lost the toss, Isis took to the field and Wiley-Blackwells arrived in dribs and drabs before the game commenced. When it did start, Whiter opened with a couple of full-toss horrors despatched to the boundary, but Nick Wyatt struck with his second ball to have Jonny Gifford LBW second-ball (expertly sledged by Rich Stephenson after the first ball) and then removed the danger-man at 3 in his next over. After Pete Wiblin ran out the rather stocky 4th batsmen (who when he did hit the ball. hit it hard) the home sides batting was all a bit of a shambles, and Keith Ponsford, Dave Penhallurick and Pete Wiblin all helped themselves to a brace apiece against a tail in disarray, and without mercy to anybody under 5ft or 12-years of age. After the turn Mr Gifford steamed in to bowl and was unceremoniously despatched to the boundary By Rich Stephens for 21 in his first over and 8 in his second and then wandered in to the outfield wondering what he had done to offend his old teammate. When the young Turner brothers came on, and bowled beautifully, the Isis scoring slowed at one end while a steady progression of runs, mostly from the bat of Stephenson, saw Isis draw inexorably near/ Jonny G. capped a trying evening by dropping one. It was then that Stephenson (43) danced down the wicket to be stumped to give the older Turner a wicket. By then though, the game was all but over and it was left to Pete Devenport, in his first game of the season to edge Isis to victory.
