Match Report

Isis batted first and the dependable opening pairing of Dave Penhallurick and Olly Walter put a nice partnership of 60 on the board before the younger man was clean bowled by pace. Ravi Kella got a start but was run out before he was really able to express himself. Guest Luke Bowles hit big, but was well caught on the boundary before debutant Graham Balch impressed with some nice hitting in a cameo partnership with Paul Jacobs. 25 extras were to be OXIGEN's downfall though. The OXIGEN reply started badly when Keith Ponsford picked up a smart one-handed catch at gully to send Naveen Sankaravel back from Whiter's bowling, and Paul Jacobs threw from the outfield to run out the other opener. Suresh's efforts in getting the game together back-fired when Whiter then removed his off-side bail, while Matt Stanbury, guesting for the oppo, held up an end and played a nice steady innings of 32, before playing on from Luke Bowles bowling. Selvan at no. 6 posed a threat and launched a quick-fire salvo to the boundary to keep OXIGEN in the hunt, before charging Bowles and being stumped by Eddy Hyde. Alan East ended the threat at the other end with a caught and bowled to complete his brace, before Nick 'Golden Arm' Wyatt returned for a second spell, picking up batsmen 8, 9 and 11 to another Hyde stumping and a couple of clean bowled dismissals to secure the victory. Credit to OXIGEN who came together at very short notice, and pushed Isis all the way. A bit of pre-tour practice drinking on the Eynsham decking brought a nice end to a very pleasant evening.
