Match Report

A glorious afternoon for cricket saw Isis try to reverse a humiliating defeat against Astons earlier in the season, but a horrible batting collapse and a below par fielding effort saw the visitors victorious again. Winning the toss and electing to bat, Isis started well with half-centuries for both Olly Walter and Luke Blatchford, but both holed out before pushing their advantage to the inviting bowling of Steve Smith, and when Suresh Sivalingam became his third caught victim Isis wickets started to fall with alarming alacrity. A controversial LBW against Jacobs added to the Isis woe, who were now consigned to scratching around for runs, and the innings closed when Wyatt was run out with the score on 164. Needless to say, Isis were about 50-60 runs short of par, and the odds were in favour of Astons. Isis started well enough, but while they kept the runs down in the first eight overs, wickets did not fall and so Captain Wyatt turned to slow bowling in an effort to buy a wicket. While Joe Walter had left-handed opener Harris stumped early into his spell, the subsequent partnership between Smith and Allan did the damage. There was not much luck for Isis, but they did not help themselves with some lacklustre fielding and a missed run-out opportunity that had Smith stranded half-way through his innings, but which he somehow survived when the ball was fumbled at the wicket. Unfortunately, the wickets that did fall had cost too much, and Astons passed the finishing post at a canter, and with lots of balls to spare. Fair play to them though; once again they were the better team and worthy winners.
