Match Report (Luke Blatchford)

On a muggy Sunday in Wytham old rivalries were renewed. Captain Wyatt inserted Wytham who held their own against fine opening spells from Jonathan Ponsford and Nick Wyatt, the few runs coming from squirts across the infamous 'ridge and furrow' outfield. A change in attack, uniting Easty and Keith Ponsford, brought the first breakthrough, with the latter finding good line and length on the notoriously narrow Wytham Astro-turf. With Wytham stalled after the first ten overs, Isis had gained the upper-hand, but their progress was rudely interrupted by the arrival of Schmidt The Cannon (a man more used to holding a baseball bat), who hammered a series of fours around his favoured leg side. Roy Blatchford was introduced into the attack and, whilst finding it difficult to maintain a consistent width, wheedled out three batsmen. At the other end young Kieran Malcolm bowled with commendable consistency, bowling The Cannon, much to Isis fielders' relief. Wytham's total crept to a reasonable 147, aided and abetted by top scorer Extras 33. High Tea in Wytham Hall was its usual memorable interlude, before Luke Blatchford and Ravi Kella opened the Isis innings with a brisk partnership of 62. But once the openers had departed, Wytham bowled with mesmerising accuracy to becalm the Isis innings, just 15 runs coming in 10 overs. The dismissal of Easty from a (later contested) LBW brought together Jonathan Ponsford and Olly Walter. Their watchful partnership gave the necessary momentum towards the Isis victory, which naturally came with a few final wobbles. Top scoring Walter ('mugged' earlier in the day by a plumber) and Malcolm remained undefeated, as Isis completed yet another win over the old enemy. Wytham's on-field chatter and hospitality remain unparalleled.
