Match Report

This was not a game in which Isis covered themselves in glory. Pirates (Phil Blakeman's Wytham by any other name, boosted by a few invited ringers) completely dominated the game, opening the batting and scoring 168 runs for the loss of one wicket (Nick Wyatt). With the exception of Wyatt the Isis bowlers took a bit of a pasting and with a defensive field almost throughout leaked boundary after boundary. Frankly, the game was over before the Isis innings started; Luke Blatchford and Suresh Sivalingam made a good start scoring 49 from the first seven overs before the latter was bowled, but only 15 runs were then added in the next five. It was slightly odd, given the score, that 40% of the Pirates bowling was by the two opening batsmen (who can clearly bowl too) but I guess the other Wythamites would have enjoyed seeing Isis crushed, despite not taking much part themselves.
