Match Report

This match was scheduled to be the Friendly Cup final, but in the face of truly miserable conditions the captains agreed to postpone the final to the pre-arranged fixture on the 17th September. Instead, as a pitch and a tea had been prepared, the teams played a 20/20 match, and losing the toss, Isis were asked to bat. Clearly, Ipsden know their pitch and the outplayed their visitors with ball and bat. Isis found themselves in trouble when 3 wickets fell in the third over with 12 on the board, and they were 5 down for only 27, but a mid-order rally from Stoneman (30), Mo Naqvi (28) and Alf Symons (15) helped Isis recover and in the end they posted 106 for 9. Turning straight around, with no let-up in the rain since the start, the opening pairing of Keiths Whiter and Ponsford found the going hard and early changes were necessary. Nick Wyatt and Jon Ponsford threw their hats into the ring and then Mo Naqvi and Steve Cooper, with only the latter man bagging a couple of wickets at the death for not many runs. But by then the damage was done and Ipsden passed the post at a canter with 3 overs remaining. Ipsden openers Wood (50) and Andrews (40*) did the damage, capitalised on bowling and fielding suffering from unsure footings, and punished anything short or erring to leg. Let's hope that the match in two weeks' time sees better weather and a stronger Isis showing.
