Match Report

Isis welcomed new opposition Stonor on a glorious afternoon at Queens. Stonor won the toss and elected to field in the heat, Isis were not disappointed as they were planning to bat anyway. Ollly and Luke opened and got the innings off to a good start, helping themselves to boundaries off an overly-attacking field. Ollly fell just after reaching 50 bringing Brad to the crease, who hit a stylish and increasingly aggressive 86. Luke fell for 46 to finally give himself a batting average, it being his first dismissal of the season.

Harry Stoneman (14) and Ed Burn (9*) helped bring the total to 224 which was pleasing for the skipper who reckoned Isis needed a minimum of 200 with the pitch being flat and the outfield lightning fast.

After a splendid tea, Isis took to the field with Nick Wyatt and Allan East opening the bowling. Allan struck in his 3rd over, a simple chance to Ollly for his first catch of the season. That brought Stonor captain Lovatt to the wicket who was clearly a classy bat and not afraid to hit both good balls and bad. Nick removed the other opener and off spinner Singh bowled a lovely containing spell, with an early wicket to a catch by Joe at mid-on. However Stonor reached 106-3 in the 17th over and a close game was shaping up. Skipper Joe's first spell was expensive and he was required to bring on Brad to help break a stubborn partnership and try to restore control to the run rate. He broke the partnership by picking up two middle order wickets, just after Singh had bowled the excellent Lovatt with a beauty. Stonor's 106-3 quickly became 112-6 and Isis could be forgiven for thinking they had broken the back of the Stonor resistance. However Maidlow proved he could wield a bat, hitting William Wyatt for leg-side runs, including three sixes, and the game was back in the balance. Joe bought himself and Nick back on for their second spells, Joe picking up a couple to a keeper catch and excellent stumping, Nick taking an excellent caught and bowled and Joe lastly finished things off by bowling the bemused Maidlow, giving Isis a win by 45 runs in a game that always seemed closer than that. Credit to Stonor who made a great effort chasing, were lovely chaps and will hopefully host us in the future.
